We urge you to make sure your vehicles and homes are locked securely and that your valuables are not visible when you are not at home. If you are going out of town, call Frank at 255-5803 and/or the Sheriff's Department Dispatcher at 600-3111 to request drive-bys while you are gone.

Our patrollers thank our Sheriff, the CSOs and the other law enforcement officers for their past years of support. We also wish to express our continued appreciation to the SPOA for their assistance to our patrol volunteers.

Here are some crime prevention reminders to help you and your belongings stay safe:

 Keep your garage door opener out of your car if it is parked



outside Arrange for a friend to retrieve your packages upon delivery

Keep your property well lit.
 Motion detectors will deter criminal activity

To request a drive-by if out of town, call Frank at 255-5803.

- Report suspicious persons to the Sheriff's office dispatcher
- Keep bushes and trees trimmed back to limit places for hiding around your home. Criminals tend to hide in bushes to gain entry into your home
- Arrange for your newspaper to be picked if you are out of town
- Contact the Sheriff's Office for a House Check if you go on vacation
- Keep photos of your jewelry or unique items for reporting purposes
- Write down serial numbers for your home electronics
